MISSION

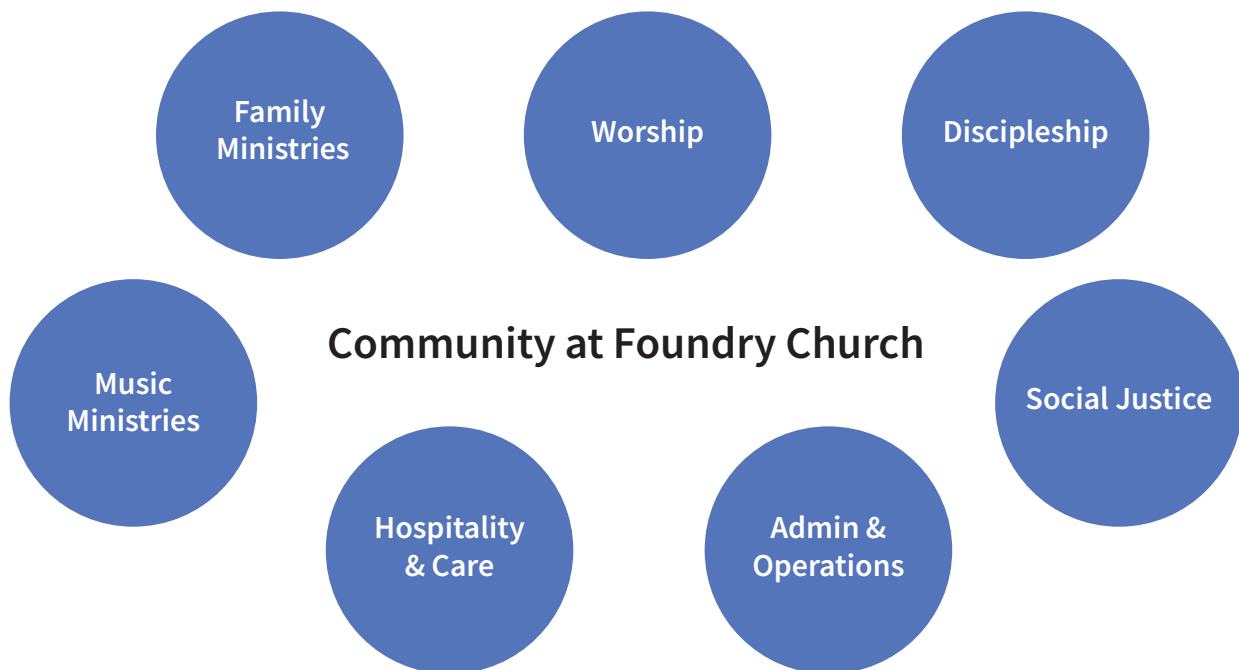
Foundry's mission is based on its statement of call to deepen faith through transcendent worship and challenging study, to create engaged community through inclusiveness and caring, and to transform the world through active service and prophetic leadership.

VISION

To be an intentional covenant community that:

- helps people of all ages connect with God & each other.
 - calls, equips, sends, and supports spiritual leaders to serve the church and world.
 - practices radical hospitality & inclusion.
 - builds partnerships in mission locally & globally to create beloved community (communities of economic, racial, and social justice).
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There are seven different ministry areas, or departments, at Foundry that work together to make our mission and vision possible. They are:

SOME HELPFUL DEFINITIONS:

- 1. Ministry Teams** promote the church's vision strategically relating to specific ministry departments. Any Foundry member, church attendee, or community supporter can join a Foundry ministry team. All teams receive support and guidance from their Equipping Staff Person.
- 2. Servant Leadership Teams** promote the church's vision on a tactical or functional level across departments. Examples include: ushers and greeters, prayer teams, and hospitality on Sundays.
- 3. Small groups** are ongoing, spiritually-based gatherings organized around the principles of prayer, theological reflection, fellowship, and service. Clergy/Staff do not lead these groups. Each small group is led by a lay-person and engages different levels of Christian education and support.
- 4. Fellowship groups** promote the church's vision by providing support for people in similar phases of life. Topic examples include retirement planning, parenthood, or stress management through yoga. Fellowship Groups are not led by clergy or staff; they are lay-led events emphasizing fellowship and community-building with a topical focus.
- 5. Classes** promote the church's vision through various learning opportunities. Classes can vary from short-term to longer-term and cater to different ages. Subjects embody a range of faith issues and life-faith interrelated study.
- 6. The Management Board** is comprised of nine members, nominated by the Nominations Committee and affirmed by congregational vote at Church Conference. The Board works with the Senior Pastor to set the vision of Foundry United Methodist Church, empowering and supporting staff and ministry teams.
- 7. Committees of the Board** assist the Foundry Board in achieving the church's vision. They are created and staffed as needed at the direction of the Board. These standing committees provide necessary support for the short-term and long-term operational health of Foundry. These committees are: Personnel, Audit, Finance, Mission Possible, Governance, Facilities, and Nominations.
